## Be Arc-tistic

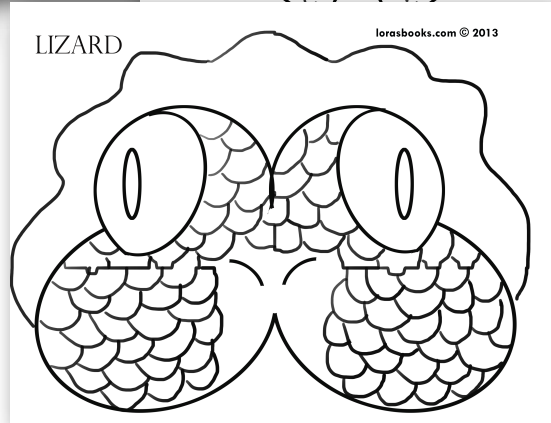
Tell the children that today they will be pairing up with an 'arc partner' to make masks of their favorite animal from the story. Using the reproducible animal masks, give partners pairs of masks to cut out and decorate. (For younger students have the masks pre-cut.) You may wish to print them off on sturdy paper so they will be more durable. Set out different stations of media for the children to get creative with. Glue on felt or other fun fabric textures. Find feathers from your local craft store or glue cotton balls on for polar bear fur. Have some tempera paint set out with cut up sponges to dab on paint textures. Short on time? Crayons are always fun too! When all is dry, glue a large craft stick onto the back and off to the side for easy holding.

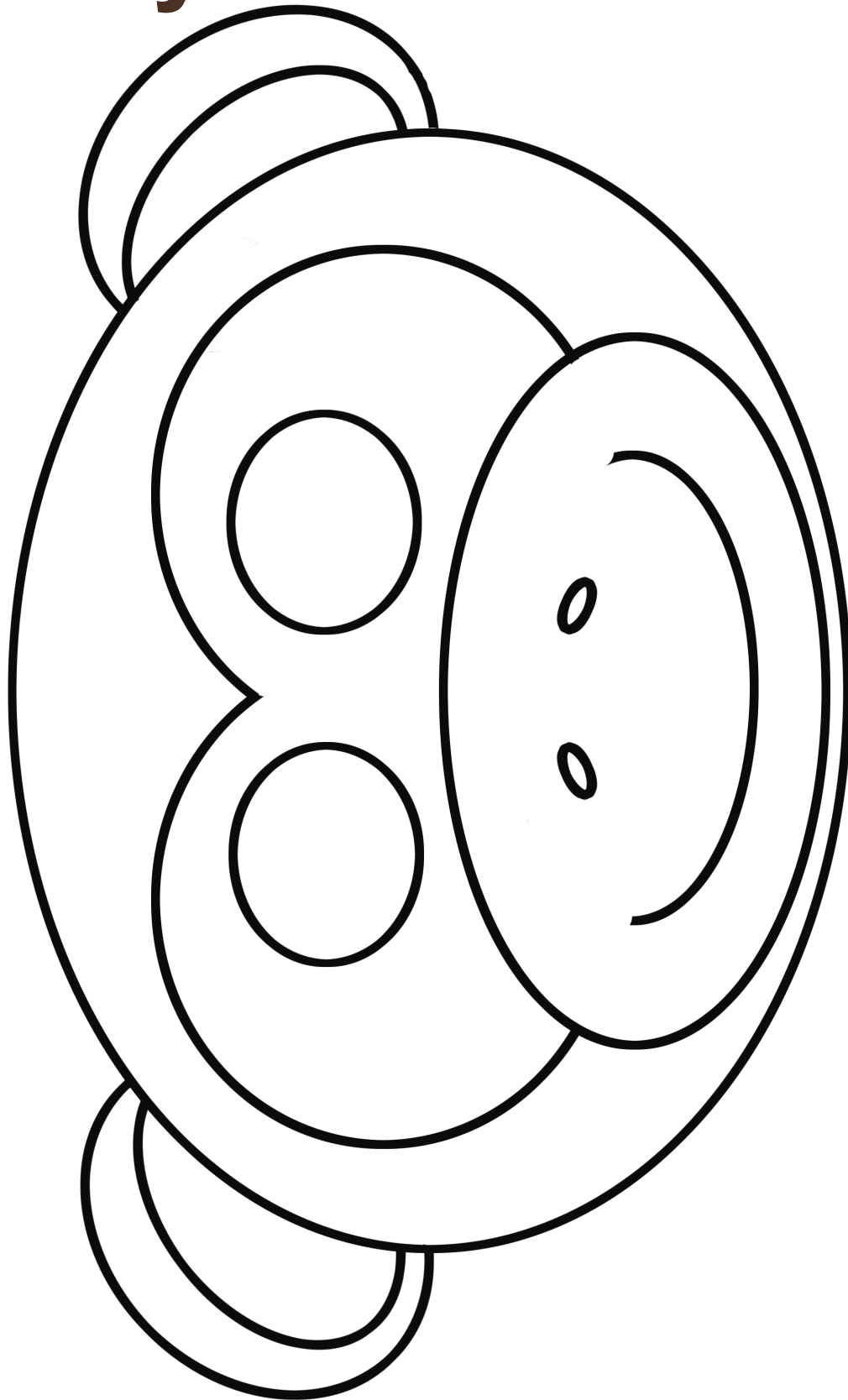

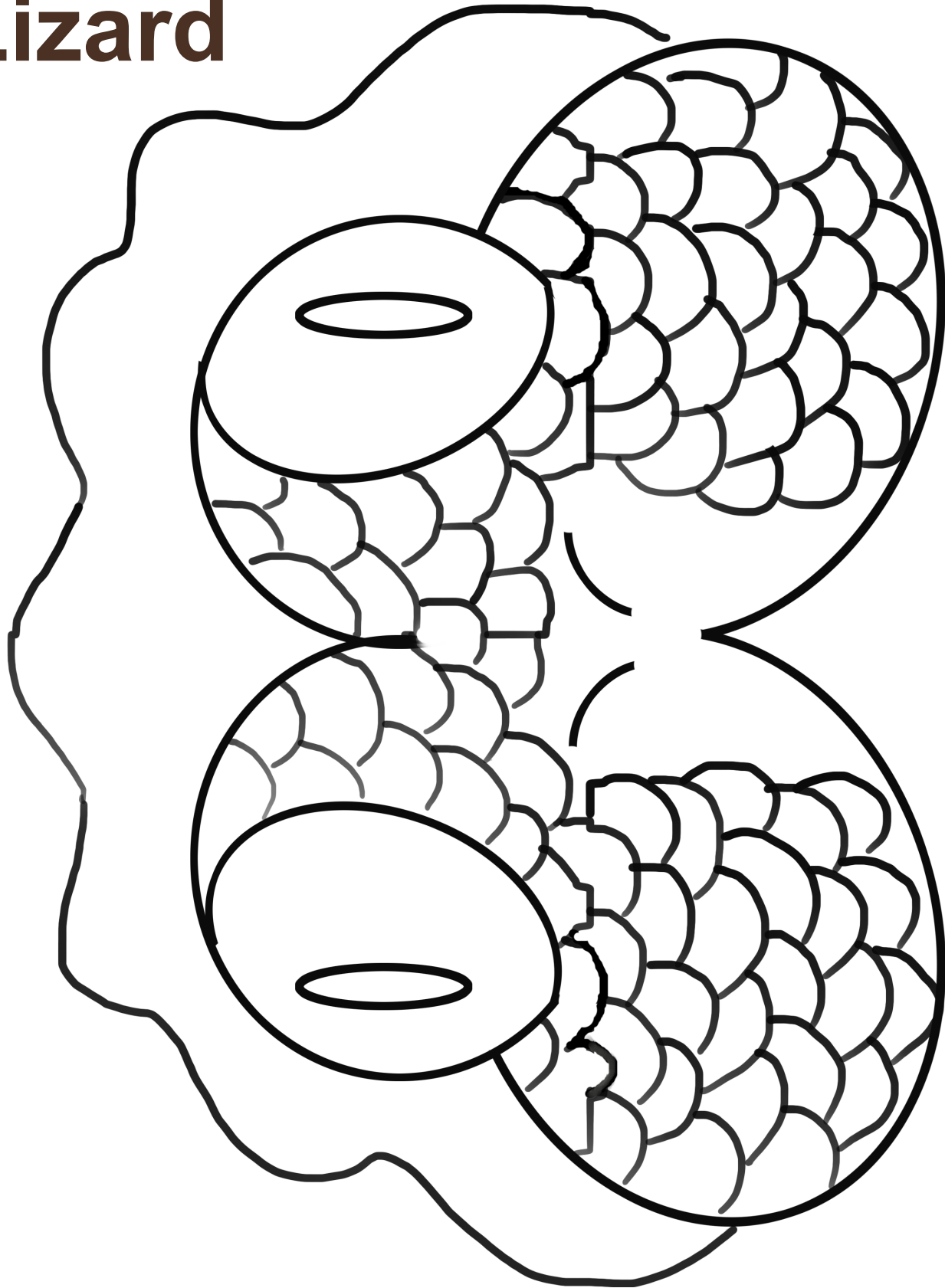

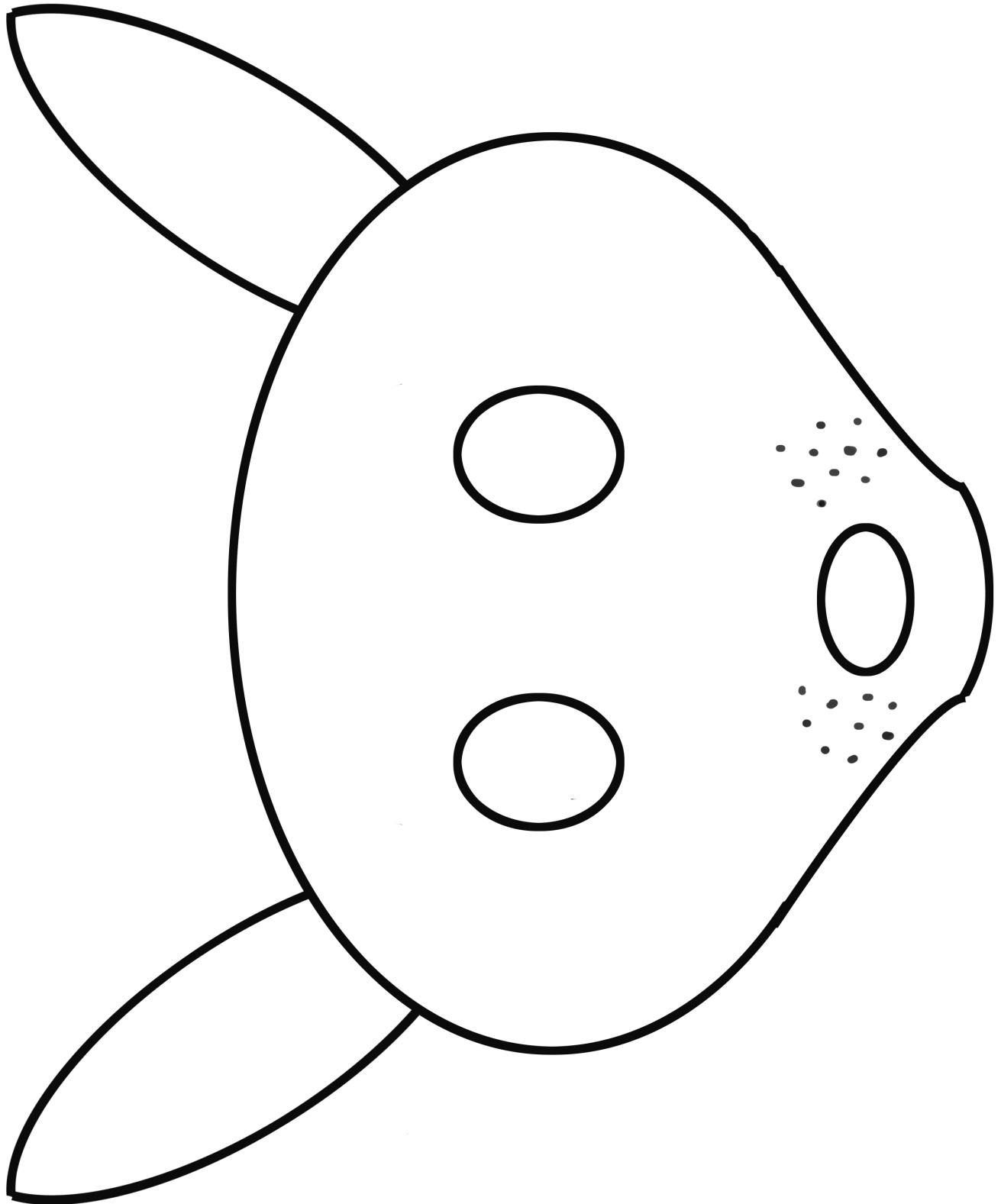

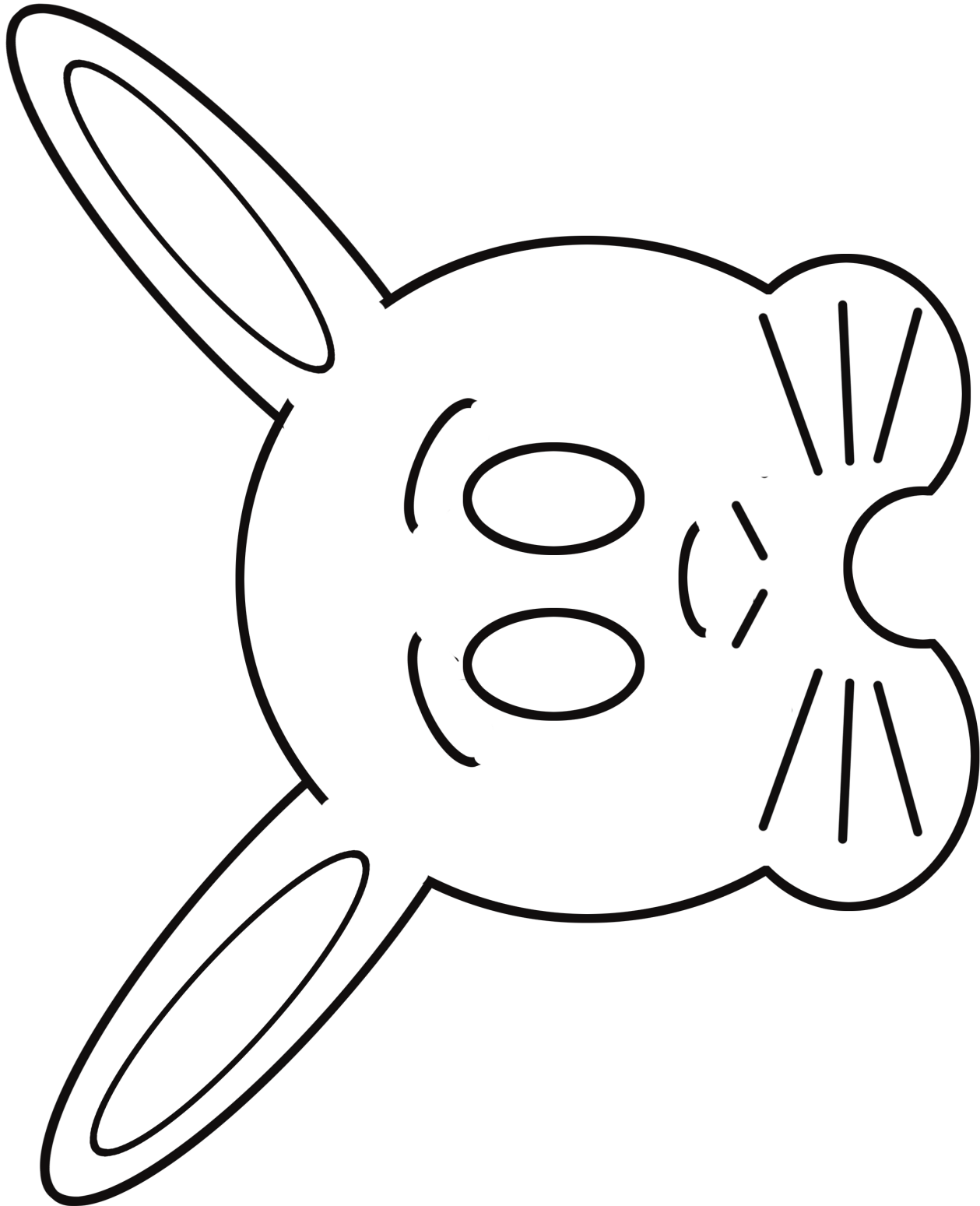

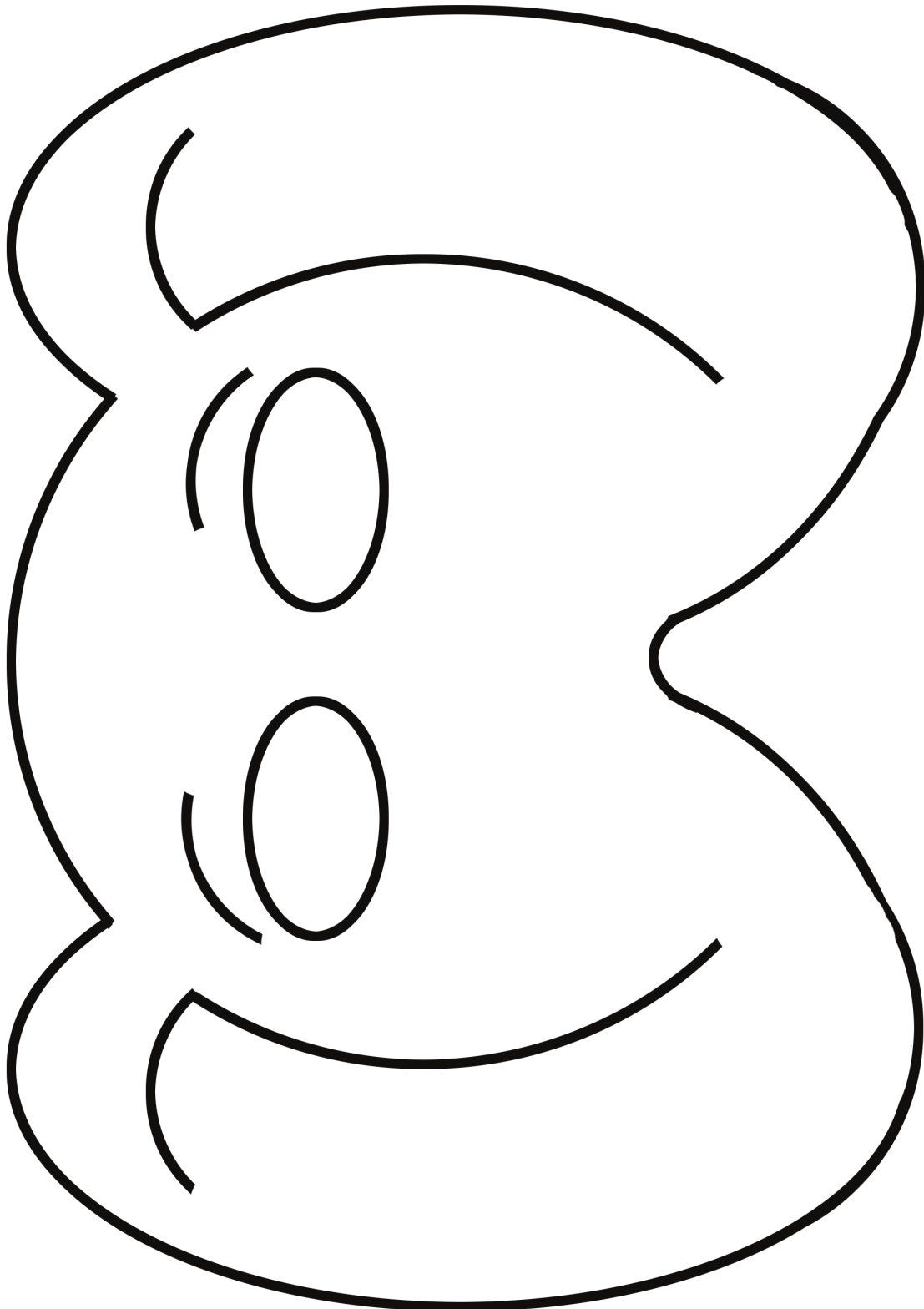

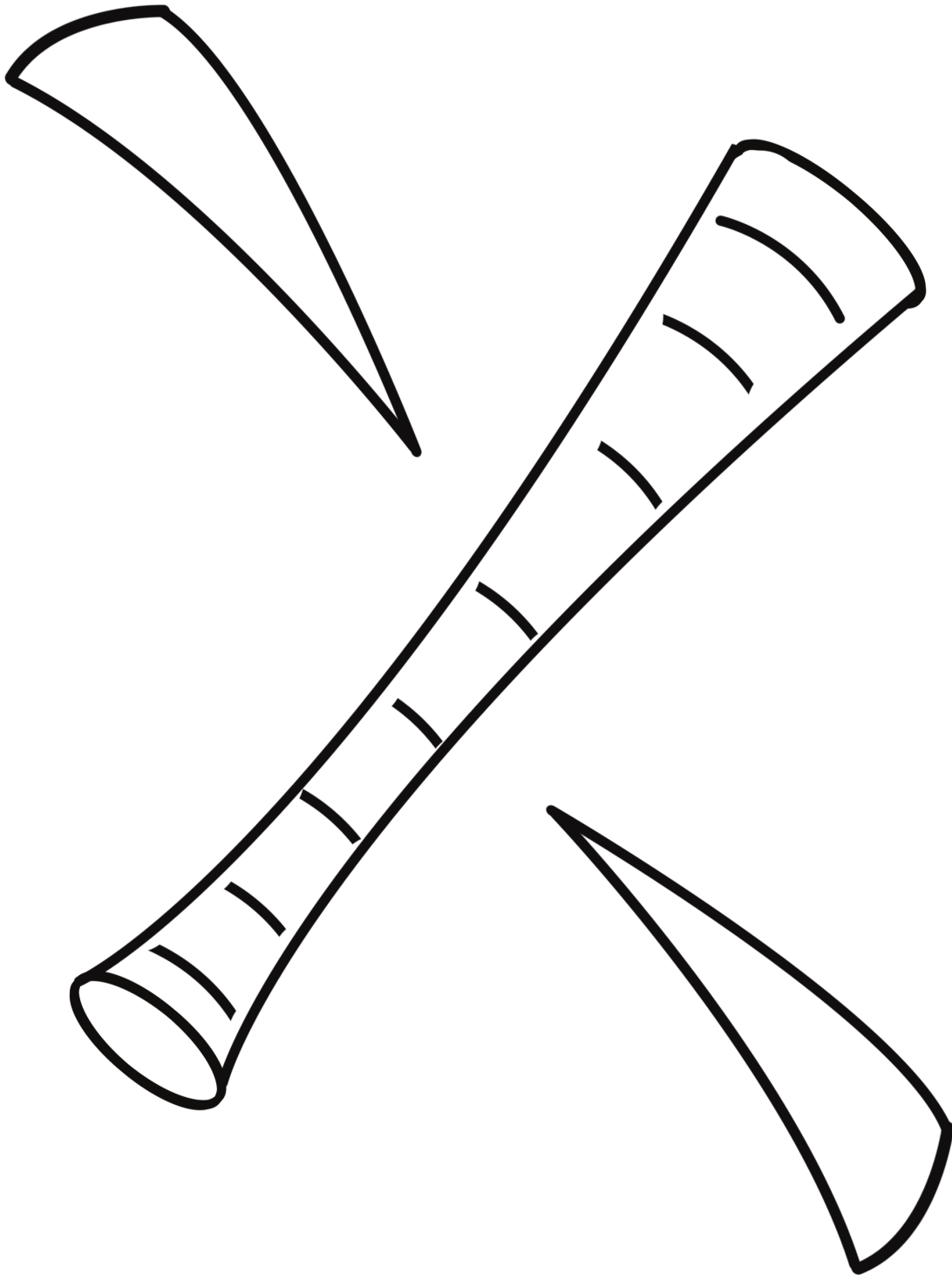
